# G.O.I Scholarship

The students belonging to backward classes viz. Schedule Caste, Schedule tribe, Nomadic Tribes / De-notified Tribes, S.B.C., O.B.C. are eligible for free-ship and scholarship. G.O.I. scholarship forms can be obtained from the college office. The following documents completed in all respects should be attached:

- 1. All GOI Scholarship holder student must submit Adhar Card while submitting the scholorship forms. Without the Aadhar card the students will not get scholarship.
- 2. The GOI form should be neatly and correctly filled.
- 3. A student should submit a certified Income Certificate & Caste Certificate from the
- 4. A student should submit Original Income Certificate and one xerox copy of Transfer Certificate, Marks Memo and Caste Certificate respectively.
- 5. The backward class students whose parent's annual income of the preceding year is below Rs. 1,00,000 are eligible for G.O.I. scholarship.
- 6. This facility is applicable only for one course at a time.
- 7. This concession is applicable only for the students of right conduct, whose attendance is more than 75% and satisfactory academic progress.
- 8. Gap Certificate must be produced In case of gap in education from the competent authority.
- 9. A student will have to pay full fee for enclosing duplicate T.C. Such students cannot avail the benefit of G.O.I. scholarship.

# INTRODUCTION

In India, the idea of involving students in the task of national service dates back to the times of Mahatma Gandhi, the father of the nation. The central theme which he tried to impress upon his student audience time and again, was that they should always keep before them, their social responsibility. The first duty of the students should be, not to treat their period of study as one of the opportunities for indulgence in intellectual luxury, but for preparing themselves for final dedication in the services so essential to society. Advising them to form a living contact with the community in whose midst their institution is located, he suggested that instead of undertaking academic research about economic and social disability, the students should do "Something positive so that the life of the villagers might be raised to a higher material and moral level".

- 2. The post -independence era was marked by an urge for introducing social service for students, both as a measure of educational reform and as a means to improve the quality of educated manpower. The University Grants Commission headed by Dr.Radhakrishnan recommended introduction of national service in the academic institutions on a voluntary basis with a view to developing healthy contacts between the students and teachers on the one hand and establishing a constructive linkage between the campus and the community on the other hand.
- 3. The idea was again considered by the Central Advisory Board of Education (CASE) at its meeting held in January 1950. After examining the various aspects of the matter and in the light of experience of other countries in this field, the Board recommended that students should devote some time to manual work on a voluntary basis and that the teachers should also associate with them in such work. In the draft First Five Year plan adopted by the Government of India in 1952, the need for social and labour and social services camps, campus work projects, village apprenticeship scheme etc. were put into operation by various educational institutions, In 1958, the then Prime Minister Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru in his letter to the Chief-Ministers, mooted the idea of having social service as a prerequisite for graduation. He further directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for introduction of national service into the academic institutions.

4. In 1959, a draft outline of the scheme was placed before the Education Minister's Conference. The Conference was unanimous about the urgent need for trying out a workable scheme for national service. In View of the Fact that education as it was imparted in schools and colleges, left something to be desired and it was necessary to supplement it with programmes which would arouse interest the social and economic reconstruction of the country. It was viewed that if the objectives of the scheme were to be realized, it was essential to integrate social service with the educational process as early as possible. The Conference suggested the appointment of a committee to work out details of the proposed pilot project. In pursuance of these recommendations, a National Service Committee was appointed under the Chairmanship of Dr. C.D.Deshmukh on August 28, 1959 to make concrete suggestions in this direction. The committee recommended that national service for a period of nine months to year may be made compulsory for all students completing high school education and intending to enroll themselves in a college or a university. The scheme was to include some military training, social services, manual labour and general education. The recommendations of the Committee could not be accepted because of its financial implications and difficulties in implementation.

5. In 1960, at the instance of the Government of India, Prof. K.G.Saiyidain studied national service by students implemented in several countries of the world and submitted his report under the title "National Service for the Youth" to the Government with a number of recommendations as to what could be done in India to develop a feasible scheme of social service by students. It was also recommended that social service camps should be open to students as well as non-students within the prescribed age group for better interrelationship.

6. The Education Commission headed by Dr. D.S.Kothari (1964-66) recommended that students at all stages of education should be associated with some form of social service. This was taken into account by the State Education Minister during their conference in April 1967 and they recommended that the university stage, students could be permitted to join the National Caded Corps (NCC) which was already in existence on a voluntary basis and an alternative to this could be offered to them in the form of a new programme called the National

Service Scheme (NSS). Promising sportsman, however, should be exempted from both and allowed to join another scheme called the National Sports Organisation (NSO), in view of the need to give priority to the development of sports and athletics.

The symbol for the NSS has been based on the giant Rath Wheel of the World famous Konark Sun Temple (The Black Pagoda) situated in Orissa, India. The wheel portay's the cycle of creation, reservation and release and signifies the movement in life across time and pace. The symbol thus stand for continuity as well as change and implies the continuos striving of NSS for social chage.

The NSS symbol is embossed on the badge. The eight bars in the wheel represent the 24 hours of a day. The red colour indicates that the volunteer is full of young blood that is lively, active energetic and full of high spirit. The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind.

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
